Task: Your task is to write one paragraph (5-7 sentences) answering the following question: If someone were to write a novel about your life, what would it be titled and why?

Your paragraph should have an introductory sentence, followed by (at least) three sentences that explain the reasons why the novel title fits with your life, followed by a concluding statement that wraps up your paragraph.

You will need to print your paragraph along with a picture that somehow depicts your novel title. Your paragraph should be free from errors. Feel free to play with font and colors. Paragraphs will be hung on the wall. For an example, see the following page.

You will present your novel title and reasons to the class. (You will not just read your paragraph word for word.)
